RUGBY

The S.C.T. had a poor season and in fact they did not record a single win until November. They won their first two matches of the Easter term and in their third match they met Roscrea in the second round of the Senior Cup. Roscrea were a much superior team in both height and weight. Despite this the Masonic side fought gamely and although admittedly the majority of the play was in the Masonic half Roscrea managed only 1 try, which they failed to convert and the match ended in a 3-0 victory for Roscrea.

For the first time the Present Pupils played two matches against the Past Pupils. The first was against the Northern Section of the Old Boys, who fielded a very strong looking team. The game was played in perfect weather conditions and developed into an entertaining match abounding with fast and open play. At half-time the Present XV led by 5 points to nil, but the game was by no means decided. After a few minutes of the second half the Past team levelled the scores but it soon became evident that they were neither as fit nor as fast as the Present side who deservedly won by 11 points to 5. The second match against the Southern section of the Old Boys, although played in equally fine conditions as the first match, was rather a scrappy game mainly because of bad handling by both sides. On this occasion the Past XV won by 13 points to 6.

The J.C.T. had a very disappointing season. In the first round of the Junior Cup they beat a very weak Sandymount High School side by 13 points to nil and had it not been for the foul weather conditions in which the match was played they would, almost certainly, have had an even more convincing win. In the second round, however, they faced much tougher opposition in Roscrea. The Masonic team, which included seven members of the under 14, were dwarfed by a very big Roscrea side. Despite this, fine tackling by the Masonic backs kept their opponents in check for most of the first half, the half time score was only 3-0 for Roscrea. In the second half Roscrea literally bull-dozed their way through the tiring Masonic side and at full-time the score was Roscrea 22 points, Masonic nil, a score which flattered the victors very much.

The under-14 had the best record of the season, losing only two of their twelve matches. Both these defeats were away from home, one of them the first game of the season, and in the other in which they were beaten

6-3 by St. Paul's they were without their captain, D. Sutton. Among the teams they defeated were Wesley, High School and Belvedere. The main strikers of the team were D. Sutton, who scored 62 points in the season, and P. Pentland, who scored 96 points.

The under 13 had a fair season, winning three and drawing one of their eight matches.

CRICKET

The season for the S.C.T. was one of ups and downs, on some occasions playing excellent cricket and on others playing very disappointingly.

The Senior Cup Competition was once more played on a league basis; the other teams in our section being Belvedere, C.U.S., King's Hospital, Mountjoy and Sandford.

The first league match was against C.U.S. C.U.S. batted first making 27 and in return Masonic made 23. Four hours' playing time is allowed in these league matches and since 1½ hours still remained we decided to ask C.U.S. to bat again in the hope of dismissing them quickly for a small total. They made 34. Masonic were left 35 minutes to make 39 runs for a win, by no means an impossible task. However, they only managed to make a meagre 24, after being 21 for 1, and so lost by 14 runs. In the next match they beat Sandford by 30 runs, but this was rather an unconvincing win over a weak Sandford team. The team had no trouble defeating a poor
