RUGBY REPORT FOR 1967-68 SEASON

The small size of the S.C.T. pack proved to be a disadvantage this year, but their spirits were not lacking. The J.C.T. also had a very disappointing season.

The Seniors' only victory in the Christmas term was over Sandy-mount High School by 8 pts. to 6 pts.

Shortly after Hallow's-eve the Seniors travelled to Belfast to meet Methodist College, the match being played in something of a snow-storm. It resulted in a close win for Methody. The S.C.T. were hosts to Methody in the return match in the middle of the term, which resulted in an exciting draw.

In November the S.C.T. met Marian College in the 1st round of the Leinster Senior Cup and lost by 15 pts. to nil. This was a very entertaining match with neither side gaining the upper hand until the closing stages of the game when Marian's weight began to tell and they scored their 15 pts. in quick succession.

This year we again entered the School's League, but we met with little success. We were narrowly beaten by C.B.C. Monkstown and St. Andrew's College.

We also entered for the School Seven-a-Side Competition, winning our match in the first round, but losing to Presentation College, Bray, in the second round.
