RUGBY SEASON 1969-1970

The S.C.T. had a very unsuccessful year, winning only two of their 22 matches. In the Senior Cup, the Seniors were drawn against St. Andrew's in the 1st round. Despite the much stronger St. Andrew's team, the Seniors held them to a 0-0 draw at half time, but eventually St. Andrew's beat them by 23 points to nil.

In the Senior League, they played 4 matches. Unfortunately they lost all of them.

We would like to congratulate T. D. Sutton on being selected to play for Leinster against U.C.D. and to play for Connacht against Ulster.

The J.C.T. had a fair season, winning three of their 9 matches. In the 1st round of the Junior Cup they beat Kilkenny College by 14
