RUGBY REPORT, 1970-'71

The Seniors had a fairly good season. They played 22 matches, won 11, lost 10, drew 1. Until Malcolm Tyrrell returned to school some weeks after the new season began they lost all their matches but, thereafter, under his influence, improved. The team won their first Senior Cup match when they beat Wilson's Hospital by 10 pts. to nil, though in the second round, after a hard fought match, in which honours were almost even, they fell to Sandymount High School by 16 pts. to 10.

In the annual match against Sligo, for the Fry Cup, Masonic won by 9 pts. to 5. In the League they made an impressive start, winning three matches in a row and then suffering defeat in the fourth.

During the season the S.C.T. scored a total of 200 points with 238 scored against them. John Phillips, with 83 points, was top scorer; with Alistair Loughrey second with 34 points.


