CRICKET REPORT 1973/1974

This team had an average sort of season, winning 3 of their seven matches. It also lost 3, and one match was a draw. The season was rather unexciting except for a splendid display with the bat by Michael Lowe who hit the first century for Masonic since 1956*. Wallace Moffett and Michael Lowe also brought credit to the team by playing for Leinster.

Top batsmen were Michael Lowe who averaged $22\frac{5}{6}$ runs per match, Philip Wood, and Harold Agnew who both averaged $7\frac{2}{3}$ runs per match, and David Rodgers who averaged $7\frac{3}{5}$ runs per match.

Top bowlers were Wallace Moffett with an average of 4.354 runs per wicket, and Michael Lowe with his average of 5.875 runs per wicket, and, finally, Errol Reid with an average of 7.25 runs per wicket.
